DAY 1 DUBLIN



How to miss the most famous Brewery in Ireland. You can enjoy the very famous brewery that produces the national drink "Guinness" where you can explore **THE GUINNESS STOREHOUSE**. A unique experience where the visitor can see how a pint of Guinness is made. You will take part in a fascinating exhibition that uses words, music, images, sounds and smells

to bring to life the splendor and rich history of Guinness. The best time of the visit is always the tasting, the elevator will take you through the floors to drop you in front of a breathtaking view, located in the Gravity Bar, the highest bar in Dublin. The latter will give you a 360-degree view of Dublin.

Explore the **CATHEDRALE CHRISTCHURCH**. Founded around 1028, she is the spiritual heart of Dublin. Walk down the steps that lead under the cathedral and explore the medieval crypt, one of the largest in Britain and Ireland, and the oldest surviving building in the city. You will discover amazing memorials, the cat and the rat and the Treasury.

Here you will experience one of the most exciting of Irish sport! Listen to the roar of the crowd, as the greyhounds thunder by!

The bookies and the locals add to the atmosphere of this unique sport. You will be instructed on how to bet, and how to judge the dog's "form".

DAY 2 DUBLIN

Recently opened, The **EPIC MUSEUM** is one of the most unusual museums in Dublin. Located in the cultural center CHQ, this museum is dedicated to the history of the Irish. Its surprising architecture will impress you with its originality, the museum is very interactive is suitable for all ages and will interest both children and adults!

Experience this unique experience that will immerse you in the heart of the exciting history of Ireland and Ireland.

Why not visit the Dublin's prison? Go to the **KILMAINHAM GAOL MUSEUM**. The Irish fight for their independency is well presented in this prison which became museum where loads of patriotic were detained (or executed) for offending the crown. Irish united, member of the movement, Young Irish, Fenians, Invincible, participant of Easter Rising ... You'll discover memories, photos, letter, press extract which set the social and political context where numerous of incident and revolts took place between 1796 and 1924. The prison scenes of the movie: "In the name of the father" where filmed in the east wing room.



You will go to **TEELING DISTILLERY**. The Irish whiskey is world famous and its history is presented by a guided tour (the only one in Dublin available in a distillery still in activity). The tour begins with the history of Irish whiskey and continues with explanations on all stages of the making of the famous Teeling whiskey. You will

finish the tour with a tasting.

Discover the Irish Craic in the heat of Irish pubs, go to **TEMPLE BAR** which is a neighborhood on the banks of the River Liffey in central Dublin. Unlike the neighborhoods around it, Temple Bar has preserved its cobbled streets dating back to the Middle Ages. This area is known as the cultural district of Dublin and has a vibrant nightlife with its many traditional pubs, most of which offer live Irish music.

DAY 3 DUBLIN – GALWAY

On the way to Galway you will find yourself in County Offaly and visit **CLONMACNOISE**, a Christian site founded in the 6th century by St Clarán. You will walk through the ruins of a cathedral and 7 churches, you can admire the round towers and large carved crosses.



Today you will travel through the region of **CONNEMARA**, a magnificent wilderness populated mainly by sheep and dotted with hundreds of small lakes (made famous by the song of Michel Sardou). Discover the tiny stone-walled and thatch-roofed farmhouses and the heather hills that are delimited by the marine coast and its calm sandy beaches.

Many inhabitants of this region still speak Gaelic and ancient Celtic customs and traditions have been preserved.

You can also visit **KYLEMORE ABBEY**, on the shores of Lough Pollacappull, a Tudor-style Victorian-style castle beautifully situated on the edge of a lake and surrounded by the Twelve Bens, an impressive mountain range. Today it is the only remaining monastic dwelling of the Benedictine Sisters in Ireland who have also restored the Victorian gardens which are also worth visiting.

DAY 4 GALWAY – KERRY

Approach the impressive **CLIFFS OF MOHER**. High and dark, the sandstone cliffs that plunge right into the Atlantic form one of the most spectacular natural sites in Ireland. A multitude of sea birds frolic there. Built in 1853 by Cornelius O'Brien, the **O'BRIEN TOWER** offers the best view of the cliffs.



Head to the **BURREN** region. The Burren is a strange and unique region in Europe. Often described as a lunar landscape, the Burren is a porous limestone plateau in the north of the Clare region between Ballyvaughan and Kilfenora. No tree grows there, no land covers the rock, the rock is bare. But the Burren is not the desert region that is believed: the many crevasses that crisscross the region allow flowers to grow

throughout the year.

Visit **KILLARNEY NATIONAL PARK**.

The park covers 10,000ha, encompassing the three lakes Lough Leane, Muckross Lake and Upper Lake, as well as the mountain slopes that frame them to the west and south. The original core of the park, the Muckross Estate is completed today by Knockreer, Ross Island and Innisfallen, which once belonged to the Kenmare Estate. The peat bogs on the highlands contrast with the largest old oak woods in Ireland. The park also shows groves of yew, swampy areas populated by alders and particularly famous, many strawberry trees which benefit from the particularly mild climate. The exceptional character of these landscapes was internationally recognized in 1981, when the park was classified as a Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO.

DAY 5 RING OF KERRY



The **RING OF KERRY** is waiting for you today. You will drive to the Gap of Dunloe and continue clockwise to avoid the tour buses. The spectacular cut of the coast with its charming fishing villages gives a pleasant rural atmosphere that has not changed in 200 years. Make sure to stop in the villages of Waterville and Sneem. This is exactly what characterizes Ireland.

DAY 6 KERRY – CORK

Go through **BEARA PENINSULA** and **BANTRY BAY** to discover new coastal landscapes. It is one of the most beautiful peninsulas in all Ireland. Located on the southwest coast of the island, it straddles 2 counties: Kerry and County Cork. Do not forget to go through Healy Pass which will give you a breathtaking view of the mountains.



If you are heading to Cork, visit the **BLARNEY CASTLE**. It is a castle, built in the 15th century and surrounded by a wonderful park. It is now partly in ruins but the ascent to the Blarney Stone, famous for giving the gift of eloquence after kissing it, is still possible. Dangerous exercise but unavoidable.

If you have time, then you can go to Midleton to visit the distillery. Irish whiskey is recognized worldwide and it is possible to take a guided tour of **MIDLETON DISTILLERY (JAMESON)**. This guided tour tells the story of Irish whiskey via an audiovisual presentation. The guide then takes you to see the mills, the malting, the corn stores and the ovens. Also discover the world's largest still and taste the famous Jameson whiskey at the bar.

DAY 7 CORK – DUBLIN

MAHON FALLS, located near Waterford. High 80m, they offer a breathtaking landscape, to see these waterfalls you can park in the parking lot and walk a few minutes along the way. Once you arrive, you will only admire the beauty of the landscape. On the road, you will even meet sheep in freedom.

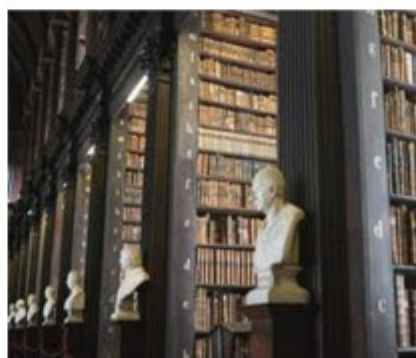




Today, go to the **ROCK OF CASHEL**. It is one of Ireland's most spectacular archaeological sites. It is located near Cashel, huge stone walls encircle a round tower, a roofless abbey, a Romanesque chapel dating from the 18th century and many buildings with high crosses. "The Rock of Cashel" is composed of four structures which are: the "Hall of the Vicars

Choral", the Cathedral, the round tower and the chapel of Cormac.

Why not visit Dublin's city center to see Dublin's Georgian Quarter, which is made up of 18th century streets, parks and monuments and its colorful entrance doors. The Irish Parliament and many other monuments are in this district. You can also visit the **TRINITY COLLEGE**, the most famous of Irish universities. It was founded in 1592 by Queen Elizabeth I and hosted on its benches many classical and contemporary Irish writers. You will also see in



these places the **BOOK OF KELLS** recognized worldwide. This book is one of the first Christian manuscripts found. It has been hand-written and beautifully decorated by Irish monks. The beautiful old library room "The Long Room" will also impress you.



Spend your evening in the famous **MERRY PLOUGHBOY**. This is a nice way to spend an Irish night! Located outside Dublin city center, the evening at Merry Ploughboys offers a show with meals and music, songs and traditional dances. The artistic quality of the show is magnificent. It is accompanied by quality

cuisine and Irish music sung by an Irish band, "The Merry Plowboys" who are local artists. The whole will be embellished with some steps of Irish dances. It is an unforgettable experience.
