### **The 13 days Inca Trail Itinerary**

#### **Day 1: Arrive Cusco – Overnight Cusco**



Arrive Cusco with a transfer to your hotel; a welcome meeting will be organized by your guide for a quick briefing of the tour. The rest of the day can be spent exploring Cusco, the ancient capital of the

Inca Empire, set in the Andes Mountains. Discover Spanish churches and mansions that sit alongside Inca remains and enjoy the vibrant nightlife or sampling Peruvian restaurants.

##### City Horse Riding – TRADITIONAL TOUR

We will pick you up from your hotel and take our private transport to the ranch near Qenko. At the ranch, we will get you set up with our horses and meet the horsemen, who will be with you for the whole trek. On leaving the ranch, we take you to the ruins of Qenko. From here, you will get a wonderful view of the ruins but if you would like to visit them properly. Then, you will need the Cusco tourist ticket (the horsemen can look after the horses while you explore). From Qenko, we will follow a small dirt path alongside the road up to the next site, Puca Pucara. The name translates to "The Red Gate" and is named due to the site's prior function as the controlled entrance into Cusco during the Incan period. We then continue on to Tambomachay, which was something of an Incan "bath house" and was also a place of worship to water. From Tambomachay, we pass through a eucalyptus forest on the way to our final destination of Sacsayhuaman, which is where the Incas worshiped light. We end our tour at Sacsayhuaman so you can take as much time as you want to explore this spectacular site.

**Day 2: Cusco at leisure**



After breakfast, enjoy a free day to explore Cusco at leisure. The foremost city of the Inca Empire is now the undisputed archaeological capital of the Americas, as well as the continent's oldest continuously inhabited city.

**Optional 1: Sacred Valley tour: US\$ 45 pp**

This is a full day excursion to the Urubamba Valley visiting the colourful Indian market in Pisac, where you will be able to appreciate the mixture of colour and tradition. Here you will have the opportunity to test your bartering skills, interact with the local craftsmen and purchase hand-made souvenirs. After Pisac travel to Urubamba, and continue on to Ollantaytambo, the oldest continuously occupied town on the American continent. The narrow streets of Ollantaytambo, along with their canals, have not changed much from the time of the Inca Empire. The last visit will be the Chinchero market. Chinchero is believed to be the mythical birthplace of the rainbow. Its major claim to tourism is its colourful Sunday market, which is much less tourist-orientated than the market at Pisac. At the end of the tour, return to the Plaza de Armas in Cusco.

#### Optional 2: Maras & Moray tour: US\$ 125 pp

##### Private Tour:

We leave from Cusco at 9am. Our first stop is Maras, from which, we can get to the salt mines. The salt mines display a bizarre spectacle of beauty. Located on a wide-open hill above the Urubamba Valley, a natural salt water stream runs underground. In pre-Incan times, they have been evaporating the salty water from this stream in order to obtain the salt that gets left behind.

How it works: The highly salty water emerges at a spring, a natural outlet of the underground stream. The flow is directed into an intricate system of tiny channels constructed so that the water runs gradually down onto the several hundred ancient terraced ponds. The water, which is exposed to the sun, leaves salt on the land. Viewed from the peak, the myriad of rectangles looks like an enormous painting designed by nature.

After visiting the salt mines near Maras, we continue on a short distance to the Moray ruins. The ruins are composed of three coliseums, which are thought to have been used by the Incas as a sort of open-air crop laboratory. The coliseums consist of several enormous terraced circular depressions, the largest of which is about 30m/98ft deep. The purpose of these depressions is still uncertain but their depth and orientation with respect to wind and sun creates a temperature difference of as much as 15 °C/27 °F between the top and bottom. This large temperature difference was possibly used by the Incas to study the effects of different climatic conditions on crops. The terraces are arranged in concentric circles and are reminiscent of an ancient Greek theatre.

In the afternoon, we will return you back to your hotel in Cusco

**Day 3: The Inca Trail Adventure – Ayapata Camp Hiking distance: 6 miles; Camp elevation: 9,678'**



We will meet and pick you up from the Regocijo Plaza (less than 5 minutes from any hotel in Cusco!) at 4-4:30am (time to be confirmed at the briefing time) and travel by bus to Piskacucho (which is called kilometer 82) where the trail starts. There will be a breakfast stop in Ollantaytambo (6:30-7am) to load up on energy. Upon arrival at kilometer 82 (8:30am), we will have some time to organize ourselves (use of the restrooms, applying sunscreen, insect repellent, and more) and it will be necessary to show your entrance tickets, passports and (if paying a student rate) the student card at the trail's first control point. To start the trail (2720m/8923ft), we cross the Vilcanota River and follow its route to the right. The first day is relatively easy (a warm-up along the Incan flat terrain) and will have great views of the site of an Incan Fortress ('Huillca Raccay'), the vast and incredible Incan site of Llactapata (officially called 'Patallacta'), the Urubamba mountain range that divides the jungle, the Andes and the beautiful snow-capped peak of 'W'akay Willca' (5860m/19225ft), known in books as Veronica. Our first campsite (Ayapata) will be an hour and a half up the small village of Wayllabamba (3000m/9842ft) in the temperate green valley of the same name. Temperatures at night are around 5°C (depending on the month).

**Day 4: The Inca Trail Adventure – Chaquicocha Camp Hiking distance: 6.5 miles; Camp elevation: 10,991'**



We face a challenging, full day of uphill hiking today (4,100' of elevation gain). The trail becomes quite steep as we follow the narrow Lullucha gorge leading up toward the highest pass of our journey. The switchbacks are well-marked, passing through a dense forest with abundant birdlife and flowering plants before topping out in the wide, open meadows of Lulluchapampa. Expansive views abound of the surrounding Andean peaks behind us and the highest pass of our route before us, Warmiwañusqa, at 13,780'. The final approach to the pass, a long steep ramp ending with a few switchbacks, typically takes about 2-2.5 hours from the meadows of Lulluchapampa. Reaching the top, we enjoy views of the rugged, glacier-clad Wiyañey peaks across the valley and the forested Pacaymayo gorge on the other side. We watch as our porters, or Huayruros, some dressed in their traditional red ponchos and chullos (earflap hats) carry their loads up the same route and then continue past us to arrive to the campsite ahead of the group. From the top our descent is steep, following a newly completed stone-paved trail with sections of staircases. Arriving to the upper meadows of Chaquicocha we settle into our campsite for an afternoon of photography, relaxing or exploring the area.

**Day 5: The Inca Trail Adventure – Phuyupatamarca Camp Trek length: 5.5 miles; Camp elevation: 11,975'**



A short, steep uphill section brings us to the Runkurakay watchtower this morning. We continue climbing Inca stairs past a small lake to reach our route's second high pass at 12,631'. A clear day offers excellent views to the horizon of the glacier-clad peaks of the Pumasillo Mountains as well as the deep gorges and ridges of the eastern Andes. Ahead of us is the Royal Road leading down past the strategic Incan site of Sayacmarca (11,811') and the smaller, neighboring ruins of Conchamarca. The descent is steep but follows a well-defined trail. After exploring the ruins, we contour along the ridge, marveling at the dense vegetation of the cloud forest as we walk on a 4-6-foot-wide stone-paved trail. After ducking through an ancient tunnel, we reach the final crest of the ridge and arrive to Phuyupatamarca, or "the town above the clouds" as the site's name translates from Quechua. This final campsite is one of the most spectacular along the Camino Inca with a 360-degree view of both the Urubamba and the Aobamba River valleys, and Mount Salcantay, (20,575') whose impressive glacier-covered summit is the highest in the Vilcabamba range. Sunrise here can be spectacular; we begin to understand why the mountain was worshiped as a god by the Incas. Condors are sometimes seen soaring above the valley on their way to the highlands, as the world's largest flying bird, their wingspan can reach 10 feet!

**Day 6: End the Inca Trail – Machu Picchu Trek length: 6.5 miles; Final elevation: 7,874'**



An early morning starts of 4am will get us into Inti Punku or Sun Gate before daybreak and as the sun begins to rise, the dramatic views of Machu Picchu are revealed. We will spend some time here taking photos and upon completing the final steps of the Inca Trail we will visit Machu Picchu itself with a guided tour (approximately 2 hours). After the tour you are free to explore the mysterious city by yourselves.

**Optional Huayna Picchu:** means "Young Mountain", the opposite of Machu Picchu which means "Old Mountain". It goes up to about (2720 meters) and some 300 meters above Machu Picchu.

It's one of most famous short walks within Machu Picchu! The climb up the steep mountain of Huayna (also spelled Huayna) Picchu is located at the back of the ruins. At first glance, it appears as a difficult climb but despite the steep ascent, it's technically not that hard.

The hike is only 45 minutes to an hour long and if you are in half decent shape, you'll make it to the top! The view of Machu Picchu is an incredibly motivating reward.

You will meet your guide in Aguas Calientes for lunch (not included) and given your train tickets that will take you to Ollantaytambo and a final bus transfer will take you to Cusco. It is important to be at the train station 30 minutes before departure train times will be given to you by your guide.

**Note:** If desired, an extra night in Aguas Calientes can be arranged. This option is very popular as it allows more time to explore Machu Picchu. You can also go to the thermal springs in the town - a real treat after finishing the trail!!!

**Day 7: Cusco – Quito (Ecuador) Transfer Cusco Airport – Flight to Lima – Connect Flight Lima to Quito**

After breakfast enjoy your last day at leisure before transferring to the airport for our return flight to Lima, from here you take the flight to Quito-Ecuador.

Airport Transfer, pick up at the airport welcome to Quito UNESCO city, the biggest, bestpreserved colonial city of America was already in 1978 as a UNESCO World Heritage Site declared. The city is considered the Cultural Capital of South America and the second most important city of the old Inca Empire.

Depending on arrival time, you can spend your day exploring the old town of Quito and the

surrounding area. ECUADOR PURE LIFE also can help you to organize a day trip such as:

- Quito City tour (including a visit to the equator line)
- Mindo Cloud forest
- Quilotoa Crater Lake
- Otavalo indian market
- Papallacta hot springs and many more....

In the evening, one of our trip leaders will organized a welcome meeting to talk about the Galapagos expedition and after you will go out for dinner at local restaurants to see the real Quito nightlife.

**Day 8: Flight Quito to Baltra Island (Galapagos) – Isabela Island**

Today, get ready to explore the most amazing archipelago in the Pacific coast and the place where, Charles Darwin based his theory of the evolution of species. A magical place where dreams of swimming with sea lions, turtles and fish become a reality. Board a morning flight from Quito to the island of Baltra (Galapagos). Once there, head towards the town of Puerto Ayora, the biggest town in the Galapagos. From here, take a fast boat to Isabela, the largest island in the archipelago and the place where most volcanic activity is reported. The island is formed by 6 shield volcanoes, Alcedo, Cerra Azul, Darwin, Ecuador, Sierra Negra and Wolf, 5 of them still active and therefore, the island is one of the most volcanically active places on earth. During the island crossing, be on the lookout for dolphins and whales (July to October).

**Day 9: Breeding Centre, Flamingo Lagoon and Tintoreras Islet**

Today in the morning after a very tasty breakfast by the beach, prepare the backpacks and hike into a young forest ecosystem, a world of recent geological history. One of the highlights of today is the Tortoise Breeding Centre, where we will see the giant tortoises in the various stages of development, from eggs to small hatchlings, to juveniles to sub adults. We will also visit the flamingo lagoon, and the area called wetlands "Humedales". This area is filled with birdlife, including American oystercatchers, herons, flamingos, finches and many shore birds, as well as the ubiquitous sea lions and marine iguanas. In the afternoon, we will visit Tintoreras Islet, located at a short distance from Puerto Villamil and home to a great variety of wildlife. Its turquoise crystalline waters are inhabited by white-tipped reef sharks, Galapagos Penguins, marine turtles and sea lions. One of its beaches surrounded by mangroves is one of the few sites where marine iguanas can reproduce successfully.

Free day in Isla Isabella. Hike the Sierra Nevada volcano (not included) or take a horseback ride to the top of the Sierra Nevada volcano (not included).

#### Day 11: Santa Cruz Island, Charles Darwin Research Station Visit

In the morning, embark in a fast boat from Isabela to Santa Cruz Islands (approx. 2-hour journey). During the island crossing, be on the lookout for dolphins and whales (July to October). On arrival, will check in at the hotel. Today visit the Charles Darwin Research Station to learn more about many of the endemic species met during the adventure, as well as the ongoing conservation and management efforts on the Galapagos Islands. In the afternoon, head to the 'El Chato' Reserve in the highlands of Santa Cruz, home to the famous Galapagos tortoise. Hiking through El Chato's beautiful scenery with those lumbering giants is an unforgettable experience! See other highland wildlife such as pintail ducks, egrets, flycatchers and finches on our hike. Also observe frigate birds, which gather to wash the salt off their feathers at a freshwater lake.
