Sevilla is a great town with its beautiful Plaza de España, Giralda Tower and cathedral. It is the capital of Andalusia and the biggest town you will visit. Situated on the banks of the Guadalquivir River, Seville has a rich Moorish heritage, and used to be a prosperous port that carried out trade with the Americas.

Córdoba, situated in the interior of Andalusia where past and modernity blend in together. This thousand-year-old city, which has the **World Heritage** designation, is a living legacy of the different cultures that settled here throughout its history.

Granada. At the foot of the Sierra Nevada mountains, between the rivers Darro and Genil, lies one of the most interesting cities in **Eastern Andalusia**. As well as its impressive Al-Andalus heritage, there are Renaissance architectural gems and the most modern facilities, fit for the 21st century.


Faro is a historic and culturally rich city that boasts a variety of fascinating tourist attractions. Sadly, Faro is often overlooked, considered purely for its airport, but spend time in Faro, and you will discover a charming and authentic Portuguese city.

Lisbon, Lisbon, Portugal's hilly capital, is a coastal city known for its cafe culture and soulful Fado music. From imposing São Jorge Castle, the view encompasses the old city's pastel-colored buildings, Tagus Estuary and the Ponte 25 de Abril suspension bridge. Nearby, the National Azulejo Museum displays 5 centuries of decorative ceramic tiles. And just outside Lisbon is a string of Atlantic beaches, from Cascais to Estoril.

Porto, Porto is a coastal city in northwest Portugal known for its stately bridges and Port wine production. In the medieval Ribeira (riverside) district, narrow cobbled streets wind past merchants' houses and cafes. São Francisco church is known for its lavish baroque interior with ornate gilded carvings. The palatial 19th-century Palácio de Bolsa, formerly a stock market, was built to impress potential European investors.



Journey Plan (nov 11th & 12th)

Days 1&2: Arrive in Madrid and get a train to Granada. I'll arrange 2 group tours, one to visit the 2 most emblematic neighborhoods, Sacromonte and Albayzin and another one to visit the Alhambra. Both can be private (should you be interested please ask!).

GRANADA

Granada has an unmistakable Moorish essence, due to the fact that it was the last city to be reconquered by the **Catholic Monarchs** in 1492. The gastronomy, craftwork and urban planning are influenced by its glorious past. Fountains, viewpoints and "Cármenes", houses surrounded by typical gardens of this city, create unforgettable corners in the city. It is no surprise that one of its old neighbourhoods, the Albaicín, has been awarded the **World Heritage** designation, together with the Alhambra and Generalife. It was an important cultural centre for many centuries, under the Moors and the Christians too, and nowadays it boasts a broad **cultural and leisure programme**. Film, music or theatre festivals are complemented with permanent or travelling exhibitions on all fields of knowledge. Old Renaissance palaces hold seminars, conferences and discussions, while the most **innovative infrastructures** are prepared for great events.

Granada has a vast network of accommodation, including historic buildings, such as the old convent of Santa Paula (AC Hotel) and the convent of San Francisco (**Parador de Turismo** located inside the Alhambra), "cármenes" (traditional villas with gardens) in the Albaicín, and cave houses in Sacromonte.

Because of its great communications, its marvellous climate, its beaches, and its snowy mountains, Granada is a unique destination for cultural, adventure and business travel.





Journey Plan (nov 13th - 15th)

Days 3-5: Get a high speed train to Sevilla and get a taxi to your hotel. Here you'll be able to visit the tomb of Colombus, but before you'll have a group tour through the city with a local through the most unknown places and a tapas tour where locals go, far from tourists. To visit the main places in town you'll have your guide book that will make it easy. I think you'll get to know this city much better this way.

SEVILLA

The streets and squares in the historic quarter of the capital of Andalusia are lively and busy. They treasure many constructions that have the **World Heritage** designation, and many districts are full of traditional culture, like **Triana** and **La Macarena**.

Seville is a prominent business and service centre in the south of Spain and has many **hotels** distributed all over the city which enable visitors to discover endless attractions. **Museums** and art centres, **theme parks**, cinemas, theatres and clubs are some of the many leisure options that a great city like Seville holds. Without forgetting, of course, the numerous terraces, inns and bars where visitors can practise one of the most deeply-rooted and tasty traditions in the city: "**Going out for tapas**".

Another good excuse to come to the Sevillian capital are the festivals. The celebrations of Easter Week and Feria de Abril (the April Fair), which have been declared of National Tourist Interest, reflect the devotion and folklore of the people of Seville, always open and friendly to visitors. But Seville's appeal does not end there, as the city is also the starting point for the many cultural routes the province offers, such as the Roman Bética Route or the Washington Irving route.

The visitor will also discover the immense natural wealth of this region, which sits halfway between two continents, in natural treasures such as the **Doñana Nature Reserve**, declared a World Heritage Site and Biosphere Reserve by UNESCO, and the **Sierra Norte Nature Reserve**. They will be the ideal setting for practising **outdoor sports**, including hiking, horse riding, and cycling routes. If, on the other hand, **golf** is your sport of choice, then you will be glad to know that Seville has four excellent golf courses in its vicinity.

Today, it is a center for culture and boasts the most alternative atmosphere in the city making it a great place to discover interesting and modern tapas that push the boundaries of this cuisine to new heights.



Day 5: I'll arrange a group day tour to Cordoba.

<u>CÓRDOBA</u>

Not many places in the world can say they have been the capital of Hispania Ulterior (Further Spain) under the Roman Empire, and capital of the **Umayyad Caliphate**. This splendour can also be seen because of the intellectualism of this city of knowledge, where figures like **Seneca**, Averroes or Maimonides were born.

If you walk round the old quarter you will discover a beautiful network of alleyways, squares and white-washed courtyards surrounding the **Great Mosque-Cathedral**, which reflects the importance of the city in the Middle Ages, and is the symbol of the city.

Without disregarding its splendid past, Cordoba is definitely a modern city that has been able to adapt to the present day, offering the most **modern infrastructures** and services, as well as a large network of hotels.

Very well connected to the other Andalusian capitals, Cordoba also has the **high speed train (AVE)** and a very extensive railway network linking it to all the big cities, like Madrid and Seville. Once inside the city, a large network of **buses** and **taxis** enable visitors to reach any destination in a few minutes.

Cordoba is also synonymous with **art**, **culture** and **leisure**, thanks to a myriad of cultural events that are organised here throughout the year: Flamenco festivals, concerts, ballet and other activities that are complemented by a number of museums and an exciting nightlife.

Meanwhile, the province is home to important buildings of the Andalusian heritage, whose highest expression is the Medina Azahara, located on the outskirts of the city. But there is great spectacle also for nature lovers. The parks of Sierra de Cardeña in Los Pedroches and Montoro, the Hornachuelos Sierra and Sierras Subbéticas offer the possibility of practising all kinds of open-air sports, while at the same time enjoying the natural wealth of this province.

CORDOBA

Tour includes:

Full tour through the city of Cordoba. This tour will begin in the Jewish Quarter, where you'll find out the origin of this city and of Sephardic Jews in the Plaza del Cardenal Salazar, moving to the Chapel of St. Bartholomew, the best example of Moorish art in Cordoba. Later, you'll visit the souk, place of manufacture and sale of Cordoba's handicrafts and whose courtyard is set as one of the famous Patios (World Heritage by UNESCO). Then see the synagogue, place of worship for this population and one of the three best preserved in Spain. Finally, you end up seeing the Caliphate Baths, an example of one of the many baths that the Muslims made in this area.


The next part of the tour is the Alcázar de los Reyes Cristianos, ancient palace and fortress of the XIVth century and the scene of important events such as the visit of Christopher Columbus. You'll also see Roman elements such as mosaics and sarcophagus, and, of course, impressive gardens.

Finally, you'll enter the Grand Mosque-Cathedral, symbol of Cordoba, whose sequence of arcs of two colors will lead you to an absolute abstraction. You'll be able to delight yourself at the richness of the mihrab and, of course, see inside it the Cathedral built after the Christian conquest.

<u>FARO</u>

Faro is a fascinating city, which combines an extensive history, interesting tourist attractions and an abundance of Portuguese charm. Sadly, Faro is often overlooked, considered purely for its airport and being the main point of entry to southern Portugal, but spend time in Faro, and you will discover a wonderful and captivating city.

Within Faro, there is a delightful historic centre that is encircled by ancient city walls, while the pretty city centre is filled with pedestrianised shopping streets and peaceful plazas. By day there is an unhurried ambience about the city, with old men playing dominos in the plazas, but by night there is a surprising buzzing and social nightlife to Faro.

The city is also the gateway to the Ria Formosa nature park, a series of saltwater lagoons and mudflats that are a haven for migratory birds and wildlife. Beyond the Ria Formosa are three sandbar islands, which are the location of Faro's pristine beaches, along with traditional fishing communities.

Faro is a diverse and intriguing city, which will provide you with an authentic Portuguese experience, and deserves to be visited. This article will provide an introduction to Faro, either as a day trip or part of a holiday.



LISBON

Lisbon is recognized as a global city because of its importance in finance, commerce, media, entertainment, arts, international trade, education and tourism. It is one of the major economic centres on the continent, with a growing financial sector and one of the largest container ports on Europe's Atlantic coast.

The city is the 7th-most-visited city in Southern Europe, after Istanbul, Rome, Barcelona, Madrid, Athens and Milan, with 1,740,000 tourists in 2009.

Lisbon is one of the oldest cities in the world, and the oldest in Western Europe, predating other modern European capitals such as London, Paris and Rome by centuries. Julius Caesar made it a municipium called *Felicitas Julia*, adding to the name *Olissipo*. Ruled by a series of Germanic tribes from the 5th century, it was captured by the Moors in the 8th century. In 1147, the Crusaders under Afonso Henriques reconquered the city and since then it has been a major political, economic and cultural centre of Portugal. Unlike most capital cities, Lisbon's status as the capital of Portugal has never been granted or confirmed officially – by statute or in written form. Its position as the capital has formed through constitutional convention, making its position as *de facto* capital a part of the Constitution of Portugal.


PRIVATE TRANSFER & TOUR LISBON - PORTO WITH STOPS IN NAZARÉ & ÓBIDOS

PORTO

Porto, is the second-largest city in Portugal, after Lisbon, and one of the major urban areas in Southwestern Europe.

Located along the Douro river estuary in Northern Portugal, Porto is one of the oldest European centres, and its historical core was proclaimed a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1996. The western part of its urban area extends to the coastline of the Atlantic Ocean.

Its settlement dates back many centuries, when it was an outpost of the Roman Empire. Its combined Celtic-Latin name, Portus Cale, has been referred to as the origin of the name "Portugal", based on transliteration and oral evolution from Latin. In Portuguese, the name of the city is spelled with a definite article ("o Porto"; English: *the port*).

One of Portugal's internationally famous exports, port wine, is named for Porto, since the metropolitan area, and in particular the *caves* of Vila Nova de Gaia, were responsible for the packaging, transport and export of the fortified wine. In 2014, Porto was elected *The Best European Destination* by the Best European Destinations Agency.
