Over these 90 years, Tsukiji has become one of the largest markets in the world. The auction area of Tsukiji relocated to Toyosu in October 2018 prior to the Olympics coming to Tokyo in 2020. The outer markets remain in the same Tsukiji location and for them, it is business as usual.
Includes: **Senso-ji (Asakusa) Temple and Nakamise Arcade (60 min)** - Home of Tokyo's largest and oldest Buddhist temple
Also known as Asakusa Kannon Temple, it is one of Tokyo's most colorful and popular temples. Legend says that in the year 628, two brothers fished a statue of Kannon, the goddess of mercy out of the Sumida River and even though they put the statue back in the river, it always returned to them. Nakamise is the shopping street that has been providing temple visitors with a variety of traditional, local snacks and tourist souvenirs for centuries.

It was completed in 1626 by the third Tokugawa shogun, Iemitsu, who used the remains of castles such as Fushimi Castle to complete it. |
| | | Includes: Kinkaku-ji (Golden Pavilion) Temple (45 min) - The shimmering icon of Japan (please be prepared for some crowds) |
| | | A World Heritage site. The wooden architecture is covered in thin layers of pure gold and is surrounded by a Buddhism pond that is perfect and represents the Pure Land of Buddha. Listen to the story of how this Temple was burnt down by a novice 22 year Monk in the year 1450 but was able to be rebuilt by the year 1455. |
| | | Includes: Kyoto Imperial Palace (40 min) - Residence of Japan's Imperial family until 1868 when it moved the capital to Tokyo |
| | | Located within the spacious Kyoto Imperial Park this palace and its surrounding buildings was the residence of Japan's Imperial family up until 1868 when Japan moved its capital to Tokyo. Besides the historical buildings, there are numerous cherry blossom trees here lining the many walking paths for you to enjoy during the spring. |

| | | Includes: Fushimi Inari Shrine (30 min) - Japan's most visited shrine and home to 10,000 Red Torii Gates |
| | | Fushimi Inari Shrine is the most visited Shrine in Japan, and also is the headquarters to all Inari Shrines throughout Japan which amount to over 30,000. Walk the grounds and see all the thousands of Red Torii Gates here and try your luck to lift the stone ball so your wish comes true. Fushimi Inari Shrine is a Shrine that brings fortune / wealth to your business. |
| | | Includes: Sanjusangendo Temple - (30 min) - A temple housing 1,001 Kannon statues and also Japan's longest wooden structure |
| | | Sanjusangendo Temple is an excellent example of flawless architecture. The Building is 121 meters in length and completely made of wood. An art form in itself, but once you are inside, you can see 1001 Buddhist statues that are lined in 10 rows, and are and are incredibly symmetrical. No two Statues have the same pose or expression, and the front 12 statues are without out a doubt Japanese national treasures. The largest Buddha Statue in the center is the what all the guardians are protecting, and walking the long hall you can feel a powerful spirituality. All School children in Japan will come here once in their life on a school excursion, and I think you will come here and shoot arrows for some 40 meters which has been a tradition since the Samurai also did this many hundreds of years ago. |
| | | Includes: Kiyomizudera Temple (70 min) - One of Japan's most famous temples perched on the side of a hill with breathtaking views of Kyoto |
| | | Over 1200 years have passed since the foundation of Kiyomizu-dera Temple. Halfway up Mt. Otowa, one of the peaks in Kyoto's Higashiyama mountain range, stands the temple, to which large numbers of visitors come to pay their respects to Kannon, a deity of great mercy and compassion. For this reason, our temple is known as a "Kannon Reijo." "Reijo" is a Japanese word meaning a "holy place" with which the Kannon's compassion is abundant. Kiyomizu Temple is built on the side of the hill, solely for one reason. The Kanon or Gods only come to the need of people in time of problems. It is called GAKEPUCHI in Japanese, and Gake means "side of Hill". There the temple was built on the slopes where gods will appear in the time of need. If you love architecture you will be astounded at this huge wooden structure, because not one nail was used in its creation and yet it still can withstand any earthquake of even over Magnitude 7. |
