

Day 1: Nairobi – Maasai Mara

Pick up from your hotel at 7.30 am drive to Masai Mara in time for lunch and siesta at your lodge. Masai Mara National Reserve is the most popular tourism destination in Kenya. The wildlife reserve is situated in the Great Rift Valley and is mainly an open grassland. The yearly wildebeest migration is the world's most popular wonder involving over 1.5 million animals arriving from Serengeti in Tanzania in July and departing back in November. Nowhere in the whole of Africa is such abundant wildlife, and it's for this reason a visitor seldom misses to see the popular big five (buffalo, lion, elephant, leopard and rhino). The legendary Mara is known as an impressive wildlife destination in the World, promising an excellent opportunity of seeing the 'Big Five'. At 14h00, your first safari drive begins through the great plains to spot the big five, birds and other animals. Before nightfall, return to your lodge for the night to be spent at Mara Sopa Lodge.

Day 2: Full day to explore the park Maasai Mara

Wake up to an early morning game viewing drive with the return for breakfast and leisure by the poolside. There is an afternoon game spotting drive in this incomparable game reserve in Kenya, celebrated for its high wildlife numbers especially the big five, wildebeest migration in July to October each year, over 450 identified bird species among other animals including its paralleled scenic beauty of this tree-studded Maasai Mara.

Spend the night Mara Sopa Lodge, offering comfortable cottage accommodation. All the buildings follow the planning of ancient African spherical homes with cone-like roofs, and therefore these stretch along the hills with the imposingly giant public space buildings and the pool at their center.

Dinner and night at Mara Sopa Lodge, B, L, D.

Day 3: Maasai Mara with drop off Isebania border after your safari

Wake to a pre-dawn game viewing safari being the best suited to see the cats hunting with a return for breakfast and check out. The return journey back to Nairobi begins and there will be stopovers for souvenir shopping and Great Rift Valley View Point. The tour ends with a drop-off at Isebania Border. Meet and greet your guide at the border, after paper work change vehicles and jump to the one which will proceed with Tanzania part and drive to Lake Victoria, Speke Bay Hotel. Spend rest of the afternoon at the Lodge. The Speke Bay is located on the southeastern shore of Lake Victoria in Tanzania. The Speke Bay is part of Speke Gulf, named after the famous explorer John Hanning Speke. Surrounded by Savannah landscape at the Lodge, looks like a small village, stretched out along the shore of the Lake. Dinner and overnight at Speke Bay.

Day 4: Serengeti National Park

After breakfast at the Lodge, check out and drive to Serengeti National Park, for lunch at Serengeti Tortilis Camp, after lunch proceed with afternoon game drive in the Serengeti

National Park, good chance to see big number of big cats, and the wildebeest are now on this area. Enjoy the park till evening and drive back to the Camp for Dinner and overnight stay.

Day 5-6: Serengeti full days game drive

Serengeti is the huge eco-system, this makes it to have varieties of game drive without tiredness. You will spend two days being in the jungle for morning and evening game drive. Safari will also associate with tracking the seasonal migration of animals as they move to different dispersal areas. Migration of wildebeest in this park makes it to be most leading game in Tanzania for biodiversity inventory. The fact is many predators are attracted by herbivores and hence regulate their population. This makes the population of these animals to rise again due to the fact of little competition. The presence of kopjes as a rock outcrop is among of micro habitat which harbors large number of predator like lion and cheetah. They always stay there due to high temperature also awaiting the distant traveling prey. Dinner and overnight stay will be provided at the Serengeti Tortilis Tented Camp.

Day 7: Safari from Serengeti to Ngorongoro Crater

Serengeti has still something to offer irrespective of having both morning and evening game drive in these two days stay. So today after your strong breakfast, you will depart to the jungle for half game drive. Later drive on the way to Ngorongoro conservation area. The two ecosystems are connected together by wildlife rich remained patches after human encroachments. So you will still have en-route game drive. Safari will have the option of passing via Olduvai Gorge for historical tour. This is important area where you can have the full story of the origin of early human ancestors dated many years back. The discovery was done by Doctor Leakey and his wife Mary Leakey at Ngorongoro conservation area. You will reach to the lodge late evening where your hot shower will be waiting for you. Have dinner and overnight stay at Ngorongoro Rhino Lodge.

Day 8: Ngorongoro to Lake Eyasi

After a very early breakfast leave the camp and descend down to the eighth wonder with possibly the largest permanent concentration of wildlife in Africa, with an estimate average of 30,000 large mammals. In addition, this is one of the best reserves in Africa to see Black Rhino. Other sightings include Lions, Hyenas, Jackals, Hippos, Buffaloes, Elephants, Zebras, Wildebeest.

After lunch we will drive south of the Ngorongoro conservation area and is Tanzania largest Soda Lake. The remote region is seldom visited by travellers and is home to the Hadzabe bushmen and the Datoga tribe.

Hadzabe Bushmen are traditional hunters-gatherers who speak a {click} language similar to the Bushmen of South Africa. The men hunt early in the morning and afternoon with bow and arrow. The women gather wild fruit, roots and tubers.

In the afternoon we are going to do walk long the soda lake for flamingos sighting. Dinner and overnight at Lake Eyasi Safari Lodge/Similar.

Day 9: Hadzabe, Datoga and blacksmith cultural experience – Karatu

After breakfast, a true African experience awaits. You will visit the Hadzabe, an ethnic minority and one of Tanzania's last hunter-gatherer tribes. They have managed to maintain their traditional lifestyle until this day in this dry and mostly barren area. Thereafter you will pay a visit to the pastoral nomads and herdsman, known as the Datoga tribe. The experience is completed with a stop at the blacksmiths where you will witness craftsmen in rather rudimentary working conditions. After this interactive cultural experience you will continue to Karatu, where you will arrive in the afternoon. Enjoy some free time – relax at the lodge or join an elephant cave walk (optional and at additional cost – please contact our consultants for more information). The day ends with dinner and an overnight stay at the Bougainvillea Lodge Breakfast; Lunch; Dinner.

Day 10: Lake Manyara National park to Arusha

In the morning you will enjoy a hearty breakfast you will drive to Lake Manyara National Park. The alkaline Lake Manyara covers over half the surface of the park and attracts flamingos and other waterfowls as well as more than 400 different bird species. But other animals such as giraffes, hippos, wildebeests, impalas, monkeys and baboons are also often spotted here. You will leave the park in the late afternoon, and drive back to Arusha. End of service! Breakfast; Lunch.
