- Paris needs no introduction. It's **synonymous with food, culture, fashion, and architecture,** rarely disappointing those who visit. Despite being the dream destination for millions of people each year, the French capital still has plenty hidden secrets to offer. Paris'monument-lined boulevards, museums, classical bistros and boutiques are now enhanced by a new wave of multimedia galleries, creative wine bars, design shops and tech start-ups.
- Iconic Architecture : The cloud-piercing, wrought-iron Eiffel Tower, broad Arc de Triomphe guarding the glamorous avenue des Champs-Éysées, gargoyled Notre Dame cathedral, lamplit bridges spanning the Seine and art nouveau cafes' wicker-chair-lined terraces are enduring Parisian emblems. Despite initial appearances, how ever, Paris' cityscape isn't static: there are some stunning modern and contemporary icons, too, from the inside-out, industrial-style Centre Pompidou to the mur végétal (vertical garden) gracing the Musée du Quai Branly, the glass sails of the Fondation Louis Vuitton contemporary-art centre, and the gleaming steel egg-shaped concert venue La Seine Musicale.
- Glorious Food : France's reputation for its cuisine (the French word for 'cooking') precedes it, and whether you seek a cosy
  neighbourhood bistro or a triple-Michelin-starred temple to gastronomy, you'll find that every establishment prides itself on exquisite
  preparation and presentation of quality produce, invariably served with wine. Enticing patisseries, boulangeries (bakeries), fromageries
  (cheese shops) and crow ded, colourful street markets are perfect for putting together a picnic to take to the city's beautiful parks and
  gardens. A host of culinary courses held anyw here from home kitchens to the world's most prestigious cookery schools offers
  instruction for all schedules, abilities and budgets.
- Stylish Shopping : Parisians are synonymous with style, and fashion shopping is the city's forte. Paris remains at the forefront of international trends, and brow sing emerging and established designer boutiques and flagship haute couture houses is a quintessential part of any visit. You'll also find hip concept and homew ares shops, and resplendent art nouveau department stores, along with a trove of vintage shops and flea markets, atmospheric bookshops and dark-green bouquiniste stalls stocking secondhand titles lining the riverbanks, adorable children's w ear and toy shops, art and antique dealers, venerable establishments selling professional cookw are, and, of course, gourmet-food and w ine shops galore.

### Eiffel Tower Summit Ticket (no guide)

Gives you access to the lifts to the 2 first floors + summit. It's a timed entry ticket, but be aware that you can spend some time in line because of security checkings and great number of tourists. No one could imagine Paris today without it. But Gustave Eiffel only constructed this elegant, 320m-tall signature spire as a temporary exhibit for the 1889 World's Fair. Luckily, the art nouveau tower's popularity assured its survival. Prebook online to avoid painfully long ticket queues. Lifts ascend to the tower's three floors; change lifts on the 2nd floor for the final ascent to the top. Energetic visitors can climb as far as the 2nd floor via the south pillar's 704 stairs (no prebooking).



A heady mix of haunting ruins, awe-inspiring art and vibrant street life, Italy's hot-blooded capital is one of the world's most romantic and charismatic cities.

#### Monumental History

The result of 3000 years of ad hoc urban development, Rome's cityscape is an exhilarating sight. Ancient icons such as the Colosseum, Roman Forum and Pantheon recall the city's golden age as caput mundi (capital of the world), while monumental basilicas tell of its history as seat of the Catholic Church. Lording it over the skyline, St Peter's Basilica towers over the Vatican, testifying to the ambition of Rome's Renaissance popes and the genius of its game-changing architects. Elsewhere, ornate piazzas and showy fountains add a baroque flourish to the city's captivating streets.

#### Artistic Treasures

Few cities can rival Rome's astonishing artistic heritage. Throughout history, the city has starred in the great upheavals of Western art, drawing top artists and inspiring them to push the boundaries of creative achievement. The result is a city awash with priceless treasures. Ancient statues adorn world-class museums; Byzantine mosaics and Renaissance frescoes dazzle in art-rich churches; baroque facades flank medieval piazzas. Stroll through the centre and without even trying you'll come across masterpieces by the titans of European art – sculptures by Michelangelo, paintings by Caravaggio, frescoes by Raphael and fountains by Bernini.

#### Living the Life

A trip to Rome is as much about lapping up the dolce vita lifestyle as gorging on art and culture. Idling around picturesque streets, whiling away hours at streetside cafes, people-watching on pretty piazzas – these are all central to the Roman experience. The tempo rises in the evening when fashionable drinkers descend on the city's bars and cafes for a sociable aperitivo (drink with snacks) and trattorias hum with activity. Elsewhere, cheerful hordes mill around popular haunts before heading off to hip cocktail bars and late-night clubs.

### **Roman Feasting**

Eating out is one of Rome's great pleasures and the combination of romantic alfresco settings and superlative food is a guarantee of good times. For contemporary fine dining and five-star wine there are any number of refined restaurants, but for a truly Roman meal head to a boisterous pizzeria or convival neighbourhood trattoria. That's where the locals go to indulge their passion for thin, crispy pizzas, humble pasta dishes, and cool white wines from the nearby Castelli Romani hills. To finish off, what can beat a gelato followed by a shot of world-beating coffee?

Explore the Vatican with this tour, including skip-the-line tickets to shorten the wait! You'll slip around the crowds as you visit the Vatican's masterpieces, including the Sistine Chapel and St. Peter's Basilica, in a four-hour tour led by an expert in art or church history. Comprehensive and engaging, the Arte Vaticana tour is designed to help you make sense of the Vatican's collection and understand its layered tapestry of art and history.

You'll begin your visit with the Vatican Palace (now housing the Vatican Museums), one of the world's great repositories of ancient and Renaissance art. There you'll generally start with a thorough overview of papal history and the construction of the Vatican Palace. Next you may veer off to the chronologically arranged picture gallery known as the Pinacoteca, which forms the perfect backdrop for a discussion of the history of painting from the late medieval to high Renaissance periods. From here, you'll traverse the halls of the museums as you head to the Sistine Chapel, where you'll discuss Michelangelo's work, his struggles with the medium (fresco) and his patron (the Pope), and the fantastic symbolism of the ceiling and altar. You'll spend the final forty to sixty minutes of this tour exploring St. Peter's Basilica, a vast church and the symbolic center of Catholicism, fixing the church and its artworks in a social and historical context—and tying it back to the themes that you have discussed earlier in the tour.

# Roma Antica: Colosseum, Roman Forum, and Palatine Hill Tour with Skip-the-Line Tickets (Small group/

Delve into Rome's past incarnations

### **Tour Description**

This four-hour tour takes you into the ancient Roman Forum and the archaeological core of the city, focusing on three key monuments: the Roman Forum, the Palatine Hill, and the Colosseum. Led by an archaeologist or classical historian, this is the most in-depth Colosseum tour and uses the ruins of the ancient city as a backdrop for discussing the rise of the Roman empire and the role of archaeology in history. The tour also features skip-the-line tickets so that you can enter the ruins quickly.

Depending on you guide's approach, you might start at either at the Palatine Hill or the Colosseum. On Palatine Hill, you will explore the first stages of the city and the legend of its founding in 753 B.C. by Romulus. You may also stop in the Palatine Museum to learn about Roman sculpture, or visit other ruins, including remnants of the aqueduct of Claudius. Following this, you'll head down the Via Sacra (the main street of ancient Rome) and past the major sites that crowded the city center, including the Curia (senate house) and the temples, triumphal arches, and basilicas around the Forum Square. You'll either end or start your tour at the Colosseum, where you will discuss Roman public spectacle and decadence. Also known as the Flavian Amphitheater, the Colosseum is a marvel of ancient engineering and construction. You'll explore the role the Colosseum played in the social life of ancient Rome and discuss how this monolith was built. At the end of your Roma Antica tour, you will have a deeper knowledge of ancient Rome--its emperors, its history, and its feats of engineering.

Cradle of the Renaissance, romantic, enchanting and utterly irresistible, Florence (Firenze) is a place to feast on worldclass art and gourmet Tuscan cuisine. Few cities are so compact size or so packed with extraordinary art and architecture masterpieces at every turn. The urban fabric of this small city, on the banks of the Arno river in northeastern Tuscany, has hardly changed since the Renaissance and its narrow cobbled streets are a cinematic feast of elegant 15thand 16th-century palazzi (palaces), medieval candle-lit chapels, fresco-decorated churches, marble basilicas and worldclass art museums brimming with paintings and sculptures by Botticcelli, Michelangelo et al. Unsurprisingly, the entire city centre is a Unesco World Heritage site.

Italy's fashion industry was born and bred here. Homegrown designers Guccio Gucci and Salvatore Ferragamo opened haute-couture boutiques in Florence in the 1920s and shopping in the Tuscan capital has been stylish ever since. A-lister fashion houses lace Via de' Tornabuoni and a Pandora's box of specialist boutiques selling all manner of beautiful objects parade alongside family-run botteghe (workshops) in a glorious tangle of medieval backstreets. Watch fourth-generation Florentine goldsmiths and shoemakers at work, buy artisan scents evocative of the Florentine countryside and Tuscan sea breeze, and know the tag 'Fiorentina' is one of the finest international labels going.

Quality produce sourced locally, seasonally and sustainably is the Holy Trinity and Florentines share an enormous pride in their culinary tradition. Their city, surrounded by wine-rich hills, is a gourmet paradise where eating and drinking exceedingly well is mandatory. Be it a traditional bowl of earthy ribollita (bean, bread and veg soup), a tripe panino at a family-run food truck or a blue T-bone steak served in a market trattoria unchanged since 1915, dining in Florence is timeless and memorable. Raw cuisine, fish bistros, craft cocktails and the dazzling creativity of modern young Tuscan chefs add contemporary edge.

Stand on a bridge over the Arno several times in a day and the light and mood changes every time. At sunset hike to Piazzale Michelangelo to be dazzled by a palette embracing every known shade of soft pink, orange, fiery amber. Surprisingly small as it is, Florence looms large on the world's 'must-sees' list – and not just for its unmatched treasure chest of art. Rich in culture, backdropped by history and anchored by family, faith and food, Florentine lifestyle is enviably sweet. Enjoy a go-slow afternoon passeggiata, indulge in an aperitivo at dusk, savour la dolce vita...

Imagine the audacity of building a city of marble palaces on a lagoon – and that was only the start. Never was a thoroughfare so aptly named as the Grand Canal, reflecting the glories of Venetian architecture lining its banks. At the end of Venice's signature waterway, the Palazzo Ducale and Basilica di San Marco add double exclamation points. But wait until you see what's hiding in the narrow backstreets: neighbourhood churches lined with Veroneses and priceless marbles, Tiepolo's glimpses of heaven on homeless-shelter ceilings, and a single Titian painting that mysteriously lights up an entire basilica.

### Architecture of Venice (Privaet tour / approx. 3.5hours)

#### Walk Description

Venice's architecture is unlike that of anywhere else in the world—owing, of course, to its natural context. Everything is built on stilts in the middle of a lagoon. In this Venice Architecture Tour you'll join a local architect or architectural historian for an in-depth look at how Venetian architecture has evolved from antiquity to today, applying a critical eye to how the city has developed from such implausible origins. This is an excellent walking tour of Venice not only for people with an interest in architecture, but also generalists looking to more fully comprehend Venice.

You'll begin our tour in Campo San Zaccaria where, opening times permitting, we will have the chance to discuss the mixture of Gothic and Renaissance styles of this unusual church complex. Depending on the interests of the group, we may then meander toward Campo Santa Maria Formosa, where we can see the modern interventions of Carlo Scarpa and Mario Botta on the 16th century Palazzo Querini-Stampalia. The campo also gives us a chance to discuss the importance of the parish church and its role in helping define and divide sections of each neighborhood.

You will then make your way toward the Rialto to explore architecture in the historic commercial and trade district, from the Fondaco dei Tedeschi, former storehouse and lodging for German merchants turned post office, to the bridge itself. For a significant part of the city's history, this was the only bridge across the Grand Canal, the current structure being the third incarnation. Heading toward the political seat of Venice, San Marco, you will have the chance to see some of the square, which houses fine examples of Renaissance and Baroque palaces and church facades. You will spend your time dissecting the form and function of these immense structures and their importance in glorifying the Venetian Republic to the outside world.

By the end of your time together, you will not only have marveled at the opulence Venetian architecture, but will have developed a deeper appreciation for the forces that have shaped the nature of the city, as well as the feats of engineering necessary to sustain these structures for hundreds of years.

#### Mine's a Mass

Beer has been part of Munich life for at least seven centuries and the brewing tradition is very much alive and kicking today. Nowhere else in Europe has a beer tradition quite like the Bavarian capital with six mammoth breweries pumping out world-class suds to hundreds of beer gardens and beer halls. And the climax to the Munich beer year is, of course, the famous Oktoberfest, attended by over six million people. Germany's 'purity law' guarantees there's nothing in your Mass (1L tankard) that shouldn't be, so if you can lift the thing – 'Prost!' (Cheers!)

#### Teutonic Treasure Trove

Munich has long been known as the 'city of art and beer', so before you head off to the pub, take some time to savour the local art scene. The Kunstareal, Munich's art quarter, is the place to start, with four major venues displaying everything from Dutch masters to 1960s design. The city also boasts some world-class museums focusing on topics as diverse as Oktoberfest, porcelain and BMW cars. And if that weren't enough, there are still royal palaces to explore – the legacy of 700 years of rule by a single family, the Wittelsbachs.

#### Well-Heeled Well-Being

The locals have a word for it – Gemütlichkeit – that untranslatable intermingling of cosiness, well-being and laid-back attitude. In Munich you will sense it most under the fairy lights of a summer beer garden, people-watching in the English Garden and behind the wheel of a BMW heading south. It may be just the local character, but a large share of Gemütlichkeit must come from the fact that the Bavarian capital is one of the most affluent cities on the planet, it's economy larger than most small countries, its infrastructure well-tended.

#### Bizarre Bavaria

Munich's various quirks, the things that make the city the place it is, might be what stick in the memory most. Whether it be the inebriated oompah band, that special knife for eating monster radishes, the Bavarians outrageous dialect, the mad hat traditions of the Oktoberfest or the surfers on the Eisbach wave – you're sure to discover some freakish aspect of Munich life every day. And then there is the local garb – nowhere else in central Europe do the locals don their traditional costume – the famous Lederhosen and Dirndl – as readily as the Münchners, so why not join them?

On arrival in Hallstatt you might begin your visit with a mountain train ride up to the entrance of the world's oldest salt mines (though the tour does not visit the mine itself), where you can admire the views down onto Hallstatt.

In Hallstatt you will have 2.5 hours to take in the sights. Enjoy a leisurely walk along the lake and marvel how the houses above you seem to cling onto the mountainside. Pass by the Mullbach waterfall and visit the local museum.

A must-see attraction is the Bone House behind the Catholic church, which will give you an interesting view into local family life (admission not included).

You'll then begin the return journey via Abtenau and Russbach to Gosau, where you'll see the Gosau Lake and admire the views of the Dachtsein mountains.

### SPECIAL TERMS OF SALES

### 1. Registration and payment

All registrations should be accompanied by the payment of a deposit representing from 10% to 40% of the total trip amount. Receipt of the deposit will enable us, among other things, to validate the reservations of certain services (accommodation, transports, ...) that require immediate payment. As soon as the file is confirmed, the client will also be requested to provide information concerning the participant(s) (family name, first name, birth date, passport number) in order to guarantee the reservations. The remaining trip balance must be paid 30 days prior to the actual start of the trip.

### 2. Payment methods

You can make your payments to Objectif France via credit card, bank transfer or other methods indicated in the section "Your account" on our website.

#### 3. Cancellation fees

Objectif France must be informed as soon as possible by email confirming your cancellation. The date of this email is used to calculate any cancellation fees.

- More than 30 days before the arrival date. The deposit will be retained, as this corresponds to the payments already made for certain services (non-reimbursable hotels for example).

- From 15 to 30 days before arrival: 50% of total record will be retained.

- Less than 15 days before the arrival date: 100 % of total record will be retained.

In the event that the client changes the number of participants, prices shall be revised and adapted to the new number of participants.

#### 4. Claims

In the event of total disagreement, as Objectif France is a company incorporated in France, the French Court shall be the competent authority. #### 5. Insurance

### 8. Air transportation & Climate

If your trip is changed due to air traffic disruption or inclement weather, we shall not be held responsible. The resulting costs shall be at your expense. Activities cancelled due to inclement weather shall not be reimbursed; an alternative will be offered insofar as possible.

#### 9. Force majeure

If external events were to disrupt the normal operation of the country (ex: social unrest, strikes, etc.), Objectif France reserves the right to cancel a trip or to modify its content. In case of cancellation, the deposit corresponding to the prepayment of the services already booked shall be withheld. In case of a change in itinerary, a new quote shall be made.

#### 10. Prices and Taxes

All our prices are in Euros and tax inclusive, meaning our prices include VAT (value added tax of 20 %), which is mandatory in France.

#### **GENERAL TERMS OF SALES**

The current terms and conditions are applicable in relation to the organisation of the sale of trips, stays and/or packages, in compliance with articles R211-3 to R211-11 of the French Code of Tourism, of which the complete reproduction is set out below :

### Article R.211-3

Subject to exclusions provided for in the third and fourth paragraphs of Article L. 211-7, any services of offer and sale of trips or holidays give rise to the handing over of appropriate documents that meet regulations defined in this section. In the case of air transport ticket sales or regular line transport tickets that are not accompanied with services linked to this transport, the vendor issues one or several tickets to the purchaser for the entire trip, issued by the transporter or issued under the transporter's liability. In the case of transport by request, the name and address of the transporter, on whose behalf the tickets are issued, must be detailed. Separate invoicing of different elements of the same tourist package does not lead to the vendor being exempt from obligations arising from the statutory provisions of this section.

#### Article R.211-3-1

Exchange of pre-contractual information or the availability of contractual conditions is carried out in writing. This may take place by electronic means under conditions of validity and performance as provided for in Articles 1369-1 to 1369-11 of the Civil Code. The vendor's name or corporate name and address are mentioned as well as the registration number as provided in Article L. 141-3 or, if applicable, the name, address and registration details of the federation or union mentioned in the second paragraph of Article R. 211-2.

#### Article R.211-4

Prior to entering into a contract, the vendor must provide the consumer with information on the prices, dates and other constituent elements of the services supplied during a trip or holiday, such as:

1° the destination, means, features and category of transport used;

2° the accommodation, its location, degree of comfort and main features, its approval and tourist rating corresponding to regulations or customs in the country to be visited;

3° catering services offered;

4° description of the itinerary if the service purchased is a tour;

5° administrative and health formalities to be completed, and the deadlines within which they should be completed, by nationals or citizens of other member countries in the European Union or another State that is part of the agreement on the European economic space, especially in cases where borders are crossed;

6° visits, excursions and other services included in the fixed price or possibly available at further cost;

7° the minimum and maximum number of participants enabling the trip or holiday to take place and, if the trip or holiday is subject to a minimum number of participants, the deadline upon which the consumer should be informed of the cancellation of the trip or holiday; this date may be set at no less than twenty-one days before the due departure date;

8° the amount or percentage of price to be paid as a down payment upon entering the contract and the schedule established for the payment of the balance due;

9° the terms upon which prices may be revised, as provided for in the contract pursuant to Article R. 211-8;

10° contractual cancellation terms and conditions

11° cancellation terms and conditions set out in Articles R.211-9, R.211-10 et R. 211-11;

12° information concerning the optional taking out of an insurance policy covering the consequences of certain specific risks, particularly repatriation costs in case of accident or illness;

13° when the contract includes air transport services, information for each leg of the flight, as provided for in Articles R. 211-15 to R. 211-18.

#### Article R.211-5

Prior information given to the consumer binds the vendor, unless in this information the vendor expressly reserves the right to modify certain elements. The vendor should, in this case, clearly indicate how this modification may intervene and what elements may be affected.

In any case, modifications made to prior information should be communicated to the consumer before the contract is entered into.

#### Article R.211-6

The contract entered into between the vendor and the purchaser must be written, drawn up in two examples, one of which is handed to the purchaser, and signed by both parties. When the contract is entered into electronically, Articles 1369-1 to 1369-11 of the Civil Code are applied. The contract must include the following clauses:

1° the name and address of the vendor, its managing director and insurance company as well as the name and address of the organiser;

2° the destination or destinations of the trip and, in the case of split holidays, the different periods and dates;

3° the means, features and categories of transport used, the dates and points of departure and return;

4° the accommodation, its location, degree of comfort and main features, its approval and tourist rating corresponding to regulations or customs in the country to be visited;

5° catering services offered;

6° description of the itinerary if the service purchased is a tour;

7° visits, excursions and other services included in the total price of the trip or holiday;

8° the total price of services invoiced and the indication of any possible revision of this invoice on the strength of provisions in Article R. 211-8;

9° the indication, if necessary, of charges or taxes relating to certain services, such as landing, disembarking or boarding taxes in airports and ports, visitor's occupancy tax when this has not been included in the price of the service or services supplied

10° the schedule and methods of payment of the price; the last instalment made by the purchaser may not be less than 30% of the price of the trip or holiday and must be made at the time the

documents enabling the trip or holiday to be undertaken are handed over to the purchaser;

11° particular terms and conditions requested by the purchaser and accepted by the vendor;

12° the method according to which the purchaser may make a claim against the vendor for the nonperformance or incorrect performance of the contract; such a claim being sent as soon as possible by any means enabling a proof of delivery to the purchaser be obtained, and, if necessary, notified in writing to the organiser of the trip and service provider concerned;

13° the deadline when the purchaser is notified if the trip or holiday is cancelled by the vendor in cases when the trip or holiday is reliant upon a minimum number of participants, in compliance with provisions in paragraph 7 of Article R. 211-4; 14° contractual cancellation terms and conditions

15° cancellation conditions set out in Articles R. 211-9, R. 211-10 and R. 211-11 ;

16° details concerning the risks covered and the amount of guarantees in the insurance policy covering the consequences of the vendor's professional public liability;

17° information concerning the insurance contract covering the consequences of certain cases of cancellation taken out by the purchaser (policy number and name of the insurer), and information concerning the assistance contract covering certain

particular risks, and particularly repatriation costs in case of accident or illness; in this case, the vendor must give the purchaser a document at least detailing the risks covered and risks excluded;

18° the deadline on which the purchaser must inform the vendor of any transfer of contract;

19° the undertaking to supply the purchaser, at least ten days before the anticipated date of departure, with the following information:

a) the name, address and telephone number of the vendor's local representative, or, failing this, the names, addresses and telephone numbers of local organisations likely to help the consumer should any difficulties arise, or, failing this, an emergency telephone number in order to contact the vendor;

b) for trips and holidays abroad for minors, a telephone number and address providing direct contact with the child or the person in charge on the site of his/her holiday;

20° the cancellation clause and reimbursement without penalties of the sums paid by the purchaser should the obligation of information set out in paragraph 13 of Article R. 211-4 not be met;

21° the undertaking to supply the purchaser with the departure and arrival times in due course before the start of the trip or holiday.

### Article R.211-7

The purchaser may transfer his/her contract to a transferee who meets the same conditions as him/her to go on the trip or holiday, as long as this contract does not produce any effect. Unless more favourably stipulated to the transferor, the latter should inform the vendor of his/her decision by any means that enables a proof of delivery to be obtained at least seven days before the start of the voyage. When the service sold is a cruise, this deadline is fifteen days. This transfer is not subject, in any case whatsoever, to prior authorization from the vendor.

### Article R.211-8

When the contract includes an express possibility of price revision, within limits set out in Article L. 211-12, it should mention the precise method of calculation, for both increases and decreases, in price variation and particularly for the amount of transport charges and related taxes, the currency or currencies that may have an implication on the price of the trip or holiday, the part of the price to which the variation is applied, the rate of the currency or currencies applied as a reference when establishing the price detailed in the contract

### Article R.211-9

When, before the purchaser's departure, the vendor is obliged to modify one of the elements that is essential to the contract, such as a significant price increase, and when the vendor disregards the obligation of providing information mentioned in paragraph 13 of Article R. 211- 4, the purchaser may, without prejudice to any recourse for compensation for any possible damages suffered, and after having been informed by the vendor by any means that enables proof of delivery

to be obtained:

-either terminate his/her contract and obtain without penalty the immediate reimbursement of amounts paid;

-or accept the modification or the substitute trip proposed by the vendor; a rider to the contract detailing the appropriate modifications is then signed by the parties; any reduction in price is deducted from the amount that may still be due by the purchaser, and, if the payment already made exceeds the price of the modified service, the excess shall be restored to the purchaser before departure.

### Article R.211-10

In the case provided for in Article L. 211-14, when, before the purchaser's departure, the vendor cancels the trip or holiday, the latter should inform the purchaser by any means that enables proof of delivery to be obtained; the purchaser, without prejudice to any recourse for compensation for any possible damages suffered, obtains immediate reimbursement, without penalty, of sums paid from the vendor; in this case, the purchaser receives an allowance that is at least equal to the penalty they he would have had to pay if the cancellation had been made by him/her on that date. Provisions of this article do not, in any case whatsoever, obstruct the conclusion of any amicable agreement for a substitution trip or holiday proposed by the vendor and accepted by the purchaser.

#### Article R.211-11

When, after the departure of the purchaser, the vendor is unable to supply a predominant part of the services provided for in the contract that represent a sizeable percentage of the price paid by the purchaser, the vendor must immediately make the following arrangements without prejudice to any recourse for compensation for any possible damages suffered: -either offer services to replace the anticipated services by possibly bearing any price supplement and, if the services accepted by the purchaser are of an inferior quality, the vendor should reimburse the difference in price to the purchaser, upon his/her return;

-or, if no replacement services are proposed or if these are refused by the purchaser for valid reasons, to supply the purchaser at no extra cost, transport tickets in order to ensure his/her return, in conditions that may be deemed to be equivalent, to the point of departure or to another place accepted by both parties.

The provisions of this article are applicable should the obligation set out in paragraph 13 of Article R. 211-4 not be met
